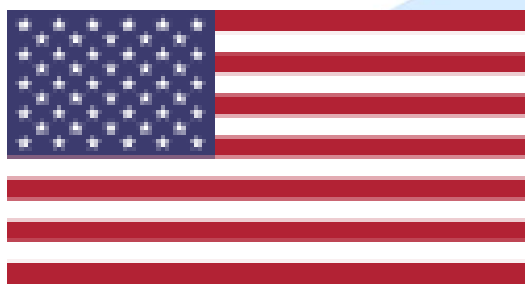
Facts about America

- ✓ The United States is divided into 50 states. However state each varies in size considerably. The smallest state is Rhode Island with an area of just 1,545 square miles (4,002 sq km). By contrast the largest state by area is Alaska with 663,268 square miles (1,717,854 sq km).
- ✓ Although English is the most commonly spoken language used in the U.S. and is the language used in government, the country has no official language.
- ✓ Location: North America, bordering both the North Atlantic Ocean and the North Pacific Ocean, between Canada and Mexico
- ✓ Rhode Island is the smallest US state in size.
- ✓ There are five US states with no sales tax. They are: Alaska, Delaware, Montana, New Hampshire, and Oregon.
- ✓ Alaska is the state with the highest percentage of people who walk to work.
- ✓ Virginia is the birthplace of more Presidents than any other state - eight (G Washington, T Jefferson, J Madison, J Monroe, WH Harrison, J Tyler, Z Taylor and W Wilson). Ohio is a close runner up with seven (US Grant, RB Hayes, JA Garfield, B Harrison, W McKinley, WH Taft and WG Harding).

It is made up of 326 Indian reservations, five significant unincorporated territories, nine Minor Outlying Islands, and 50 states. Both in terms of overall area and land area, it is the third-largest nation. [d] The northern and southern land boundaries of the United States are shared with Canada and Mexico, respectively. Along with other countries, it shares maritime boundaries with the Bahamas, Cuba, and Russia. [k] It ranks as the third most populated nation in the world with a population of over 331 million[e]. The most populous metropolis and financial hub is New York City, while Washington, D.C., serves as the nation's capital.

The current design of the U.S. flag is its 27th; the design of the flag has been modified officially 26 times since 1777. The 48-star flag was in effect for 47 years until the 49-star version became official on July 4, 1959. The 50-star flag was ordered by then president Eisenhower on August 21, 1959, and was adopted in July 1960. It is the longest-used version of the U.S. flag and has been in use for over 62 years.

In 2019, District of Columbia mayor Muriel Bowser had dozens of 51-star flags installed on Pennsylvania Avenue, the street linking the U.S. Capitol building with the

White House, in anticipation of a hearing in the U.S. House of Representatives regarding potential District of Columbia statehood. On June 26, 2020, the House voted to establish D.C. as the 51st state; however, the bill was not expected to pass in the Senate, and the administration of President Donald Trump indicated he would veto the bill if passed by both chambers. It died in the Republican-controlled Senate at the end of the 116th Congress. On January 4, 2021, Delegate Norton reintroduced H.R. 51 early in the 117th Congress with a record 202 co-sponsors.

The Declaration of Independence is one of the most important documents in the history of the United States.

It took Thomas Jefferson 17 days to write the Declaration of Independence.

On July 2, 1776, Congress voted to declare independence from Great Britain.

On July 4, 1776, Congress voted to accept the Declaration of Independence, marking July 4 as Independence Day.

The foundation of the American government, its purpose, form, and structure, are in the Constitution of the United States. The Constitutional Convention adopted the Constitution on September 17, 1787. The Bill of Rights is the first 10 amendments to the Constitution. It guarantees greater constitutional protection for individual liberties and lists specific prohibitions on government power. There are 27 Constitutional Amendments in all. The 27th Amendment, which was originally proposed in 1789, was not ratified until 1992.
