Annotation: In recent years, the methods of teaching have been changed. One of the most effective way to deliver the information to the students is giving project works for them. 1. A central topic from which all the activities derive and which drives the project towards a final objective.
2. Access to means of investigation (the Internet has made this part of project work much easier) to collect, analyze and use information.
3. Plenty of opportunities for sharing ideas, collaborating and communicating. Interaction with other learners is fundamental to PBL.
4. A final product (often produced using new technologies available to us) in the form of posters, presentations, reports, videos, webpages, blogs and so on”.

If the teacher put an award to the finishing of the project. It increases the motivation of the students. Also, students think that their hard work always pays off. Learners of the PBL method given freedom to go about solving problems or sharing information in the way they see fit. The teacher`s role is monitor and facilitator, setting up frameworks for communication, providing access to information and helping with language where necessary, and giving students opportunities to produce a final product or presentation. Moreover, the important thing is to use what works best for teachers and the learners.

There is nothing like a group project to get students talking.

They work well as long as:

- The topic is centered on the learners` interests
- There is not any real need for extensive or time-consuming research
- Students can present their work orally to the rest of the class
- One particularly successful is based on our love of lists. Students in small groups work towards compiling a top five.

And also, there could be small presentations which might presented while the lesson. A short project can be presented in one lesson, prepared and researched and completed in the next lesson.

If it comes to using technologies while preparing project work, it is the easiest way to create project work so far. Because, students who have computer literacy find it easy rather than making it by hand on the poster paper. Here I want to give some tips for preparing power point document which teachers could use while giving project works for their students:

- Create presentations from scratch or a template.
- Add text, images, art, and videos
- Select a professional design with PowerPoint Designer
- Add transitions, animations, and motion
- Save to OneDrive, to get to your presentations from your computer, tablet, or phone
- Share and work with others, wherever they are

Add slide

1. In the thumbnails on the left pane, select the slide you want your new slide to follow.
2. In the Home tab, in the Slides section, select new Slide.
3. In the Slides section, select Layout, and then select the layout you want from the menu.

Add and format text

1. Place the cursor inside a text box, and then type something
2. Select the text, and then select one or more options from the Font section of the Home tab, such as Front, Increase Font Size, Decrease Font Size, Bold, Italic and Underline.
3. To create bulleted or numbered lists, select the text, and then select Bullets or Numbering.

Add a picture, shape, and more

1. Go to the Insert tab.
2. To add a picture:
 - In the Images section, select pictures
 - In the Insert Picture From menu, select the source you want.
 - Browse for the picture you want, select it and then select Insert.

To add illustrations:

- In the illustrations section, select Shapes, Icons, 3D Models, SmartArt, or Chart
- In the dialog box that opens when you click one of the illustration types, select the item you want and follow the prompts to insert it.

These steps are taken from official internet site and if you follow the steps correctly, you could create the power point document in an easy way. You might share these tips with your students, or if you are student you find it handy.

Next question is that which is better: doing project work with group of students or individually? First of all there are some positive sides of working in a group. For example, there are some students who are painfully shy and they do not want to work by themselves. There should be someone who could help them while doing important

project works. Especially, when learning foreign languages, most students struggle with speaking out loud or communicating with teacher. At such times, working in a group could help them. The reason is that they might collaborate with their teenagers, they might exchange ideas. Besides, if the ideas are more and different then the teacher also finds it interesting.
